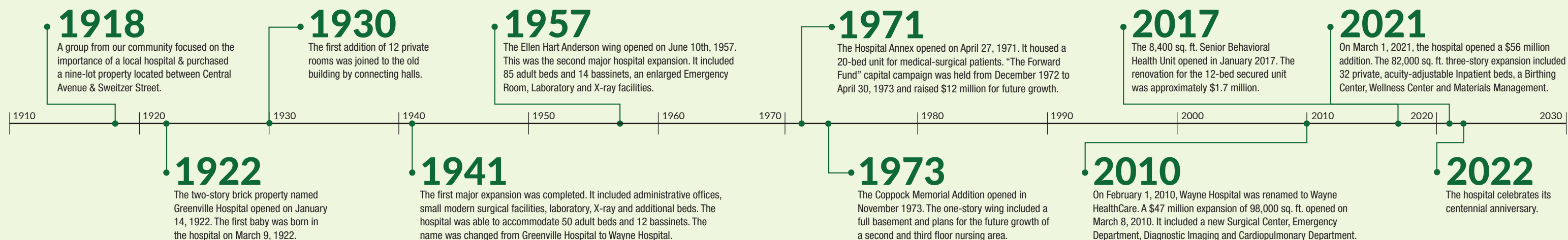

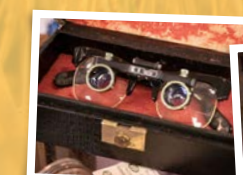
Don Mong Centennial Art

Wayne HealthCare is **fully accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Health Care (ACHC)** for outstanding hospital quality and safety standards. A survey is conducted every three years to ensure the hospital meets appropriate quality standards put in place by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS). Energy Star Certification

Wayne HealthCare received the 2022 **Ohio Hospital Association Energy Cup Award** in the small hospital category from the Ohio Hospital Association (OHA) for reducing energy consumption. The award shows that we manage our energy usage and perform conservation efforts better than 75% of other facilities. This is the second time in the last three years that we've received Energy Star certification.



Nationally Certified Safe Sleep Hospital

Wayne HealthCare achieved **Bronze-Level Safe Sleep Certification** with the National Safe Sleep Hospital Certification Program, demonstrating our continued commitment to implementing best practices to support infant safe sleep and reduce the risk of Sudden Unexpected Infant Death (SUID) in our community. The certification program was created by Cribs for Kids®, an organization dedicated to preventing sleep-related SUID and accidental suffocation in infants. Wayne HealthCare's Safe Sleep Team achieved certification through the development of hospital policies, healthcare team member training, and family & caregiver education.

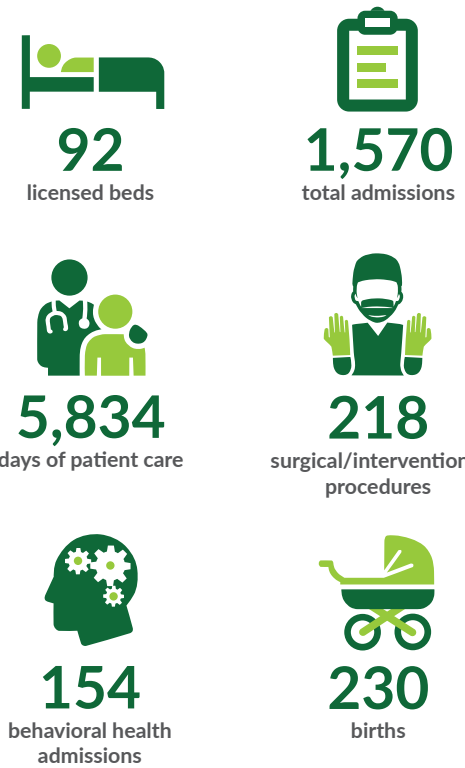

Wright State University Rural Residency Program

Wayne HealthCare along with Family Health have partnered with Wright State University Boonshoft School of Medicine to be sites in the Rural Residency Program. The program will be a 1+2 Rural Training Pathway (RTP). Resident rotations in the first year will be in Dayton with Wright State University's established Family Medicine Residency Program, and rotations in the second and third years will be in Greenville at Wayne HealthCare and Family Health.

The first cohort of residents will begin in 2023 with clinical rotations at Wayne HealthCare in the summer of 2024. Rotations will include Adult Emergency Care, Inpatient Services, Maternity Care, Surgery and Sports Medicine.

Wayne HealthCare is eager to become a teaching hospital and help shape future medical leaders by providing one-on-one mentorship and facilitating relationships with patients, faculty and the community. 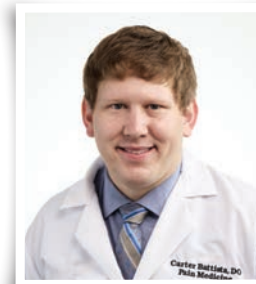

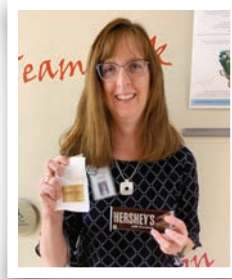

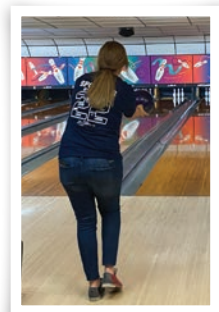
Greenville Rotary Club Lemonade Shakes

Big Brothers Big Sisters of Shelby & Darke County

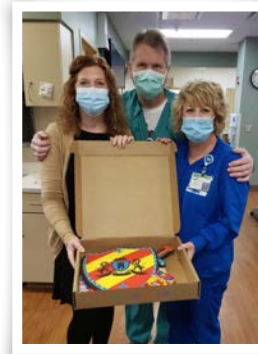

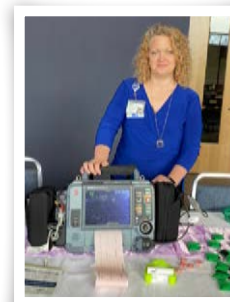
Healthy Moments

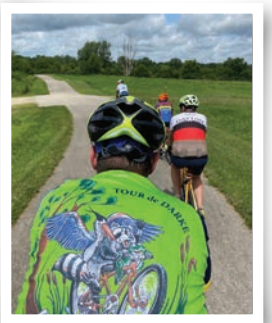
Hurricane Relief Donation

Vascular Screening Program

Each February, Wayne HealthCare shines a light on offering discounted vascular screenings in celebration of "Pump Month." Events such as the Heart Health 5K and Heart Art assist with funding. Since the program's inception in 2016, a total of **2,161 discounted or free screenings** have been provided, offering a **savings of \$61,174**. These non-invasive, preventative vascular ultrasounds can help identify risks that could lead to a future stroke or heart attack. On average, 1 in 3 patients have a result that shows a need for follow-up care. **The Foundation's goal is to change outcomes for the better and ultimately save lives.**

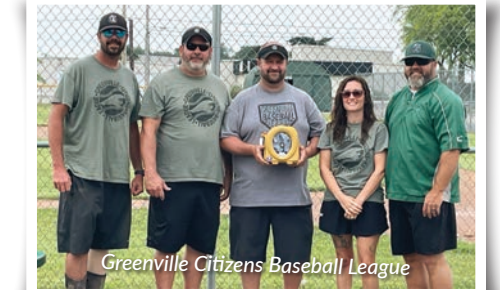
AED Program

In partnership with Midmark Corporation, Spirit Medical Transport and Greenville Rotary Club, the Wayne HealthCare Foundation provides the Automated External Defibrillator (AED) Program to local nonprofit organizations in our community. Nonprofits are able to apply for the grant program to have an AED at their facility to help save lives in a cardiac emergency. A maintenance program is also available for safe and timely replacement of pads and batteries. Midmark is the main corporate donor and Spirit provides CPR/AED training and certification for the nonprofit staff and volunteers.



Since the program began, a total of **173 AEDs** have been provided to local nonprofits, and **1900+ community members** have been CPR/AED certified. **Thank you to all our corporate and individual community donors for giving to the AED program.**

Change Of Command

...So another step has been made in the progress of Wayne Hospital and in the Building and Planning Program of it. Miss Funk and Mr. Olsen will share the responsibility of Wayne Hospital and help it to grow and better serve the community of Darke County and Greenville.
In February, 1968, the hospital installed a Kodak R.P. X-Omat Processor to develop films. The machine installed cost \$1,000. With this processor the hospital is able to develop, process and dry a film in 90 seconds. This speeds up the x-ray examination as that they are able to handle more patients in less time.
However, this has increased the cost of developing film as it takes a special type of film (Estra Base) that will withstand the heat of the processor. The machine also uses more developer and fixer solution, as one 14x17 film takes 35 cc of developer and 100cc of fixer to complete the processing.
The old hand method of processing a film took four minutes to develop, eight minutes to fix, eight minutes to wash and about 20 minutes to dry one film. This took a total of 30 minutes as compared to 90 seconds, so it is evident what is meant by speeding up the examination.
